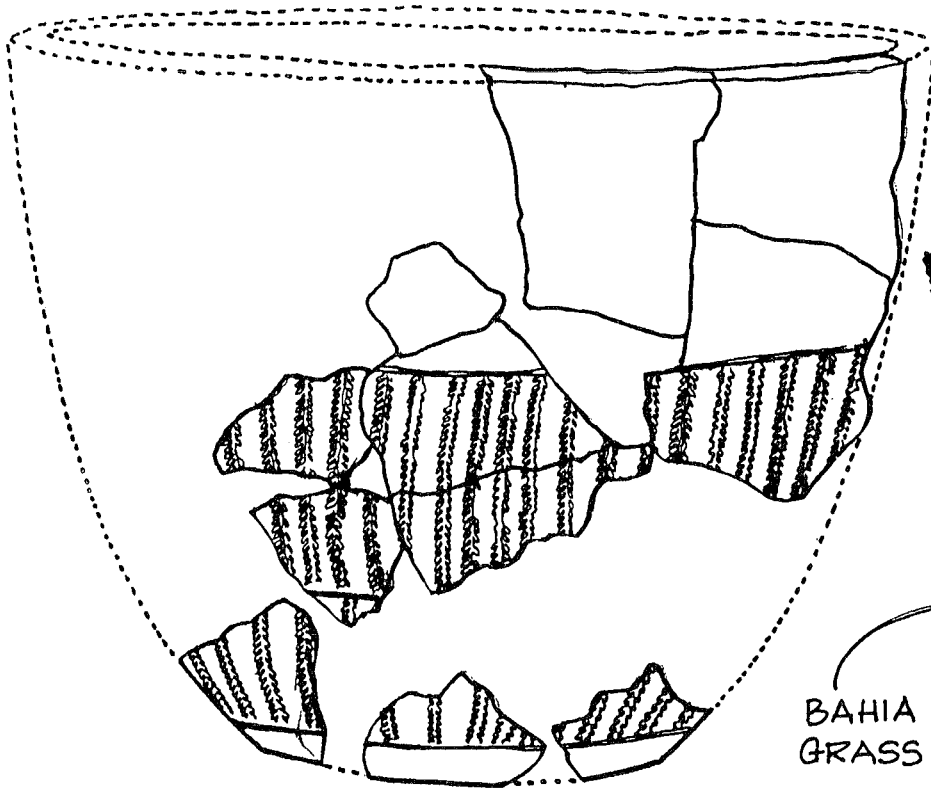


"HAWKSHAW IMPRESSED"

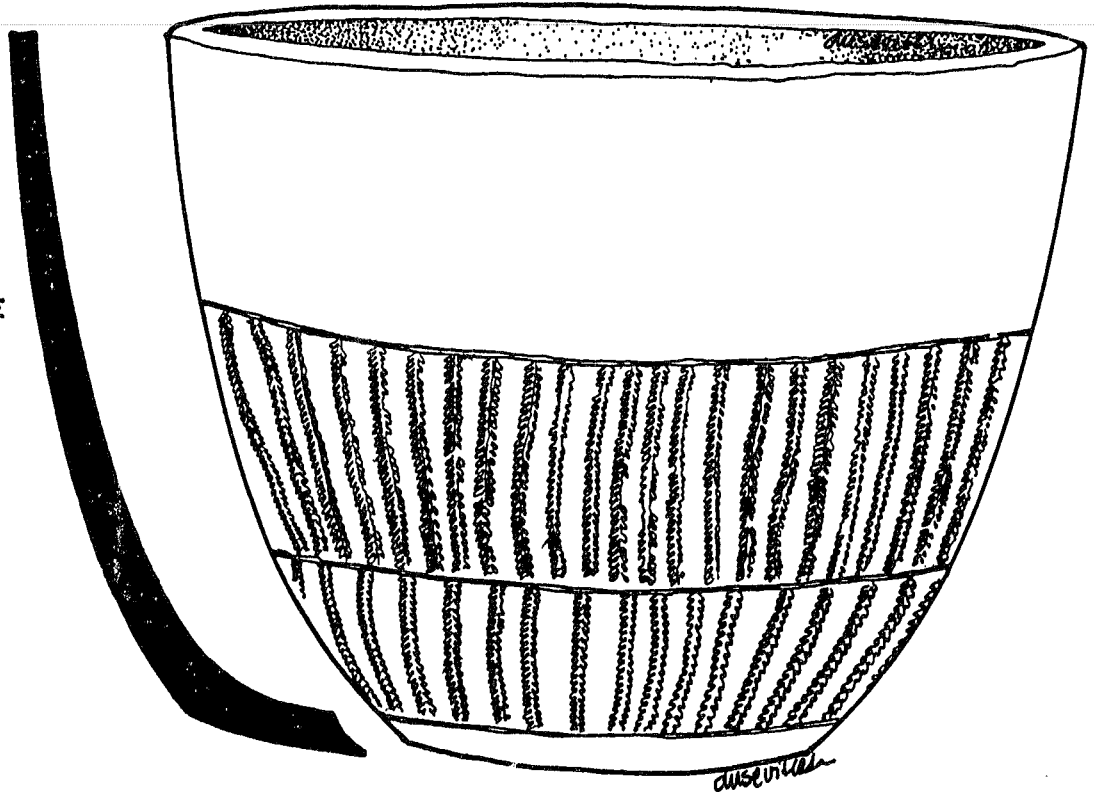

BAHIA GRASS

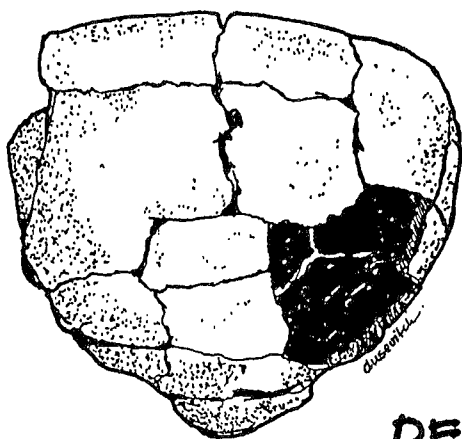

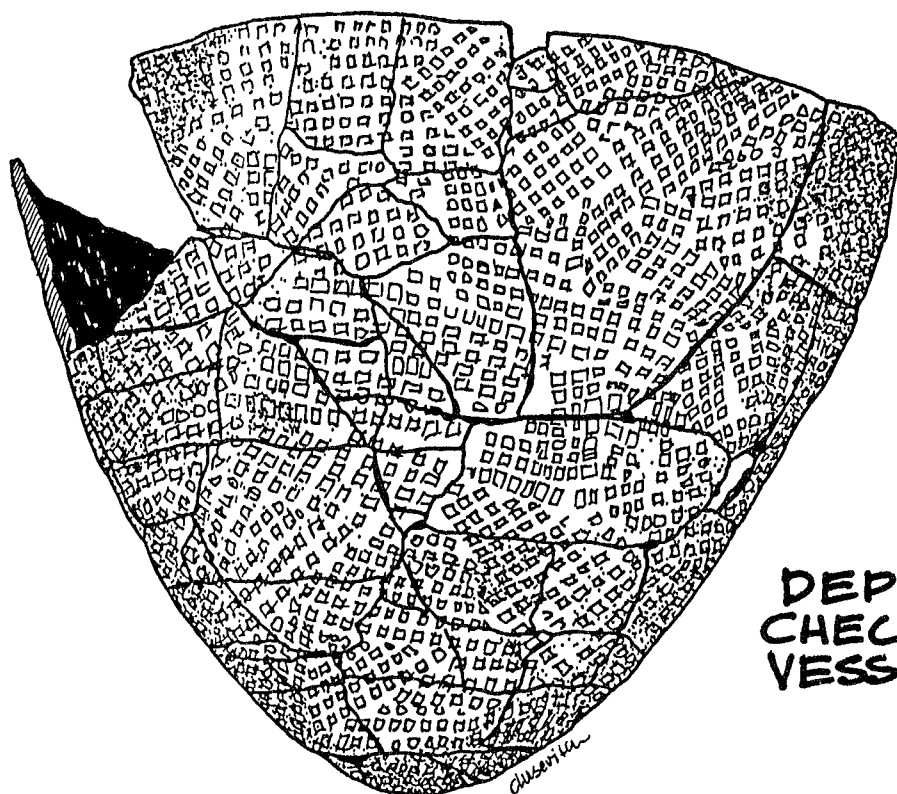
DEPTFORD POTTERY

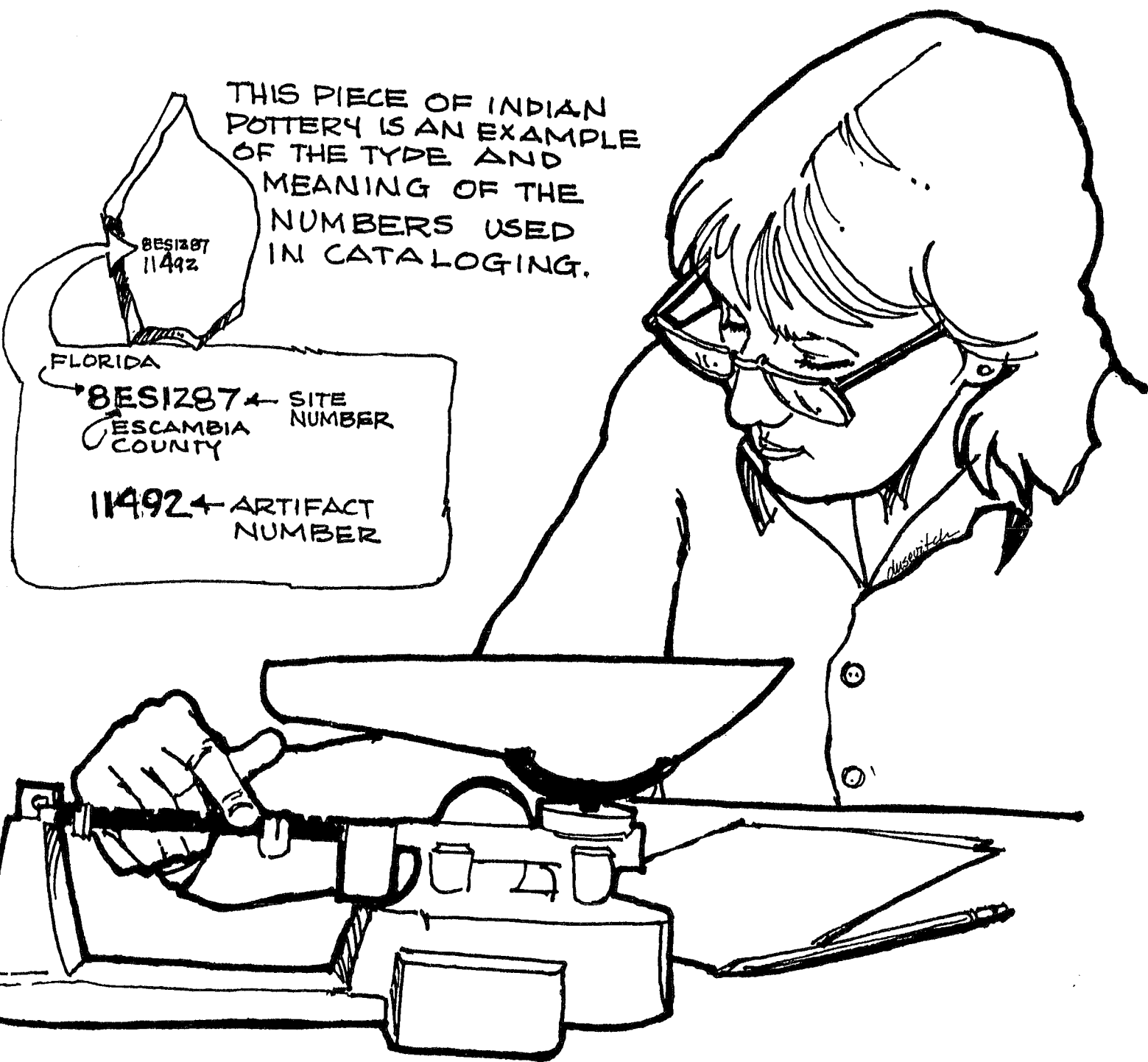

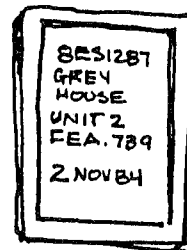

A SCALE STICK IS ALWAYS USED TO GIVE AN IDEA OF SIZE

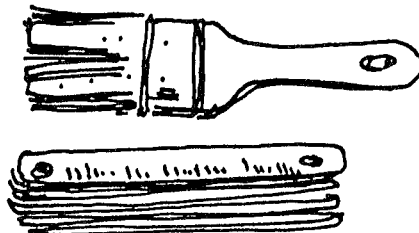
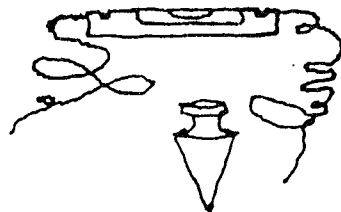
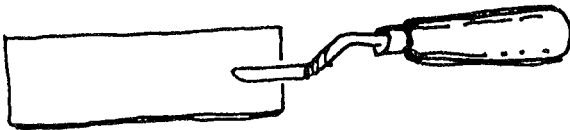

EXCAVATION STEP.



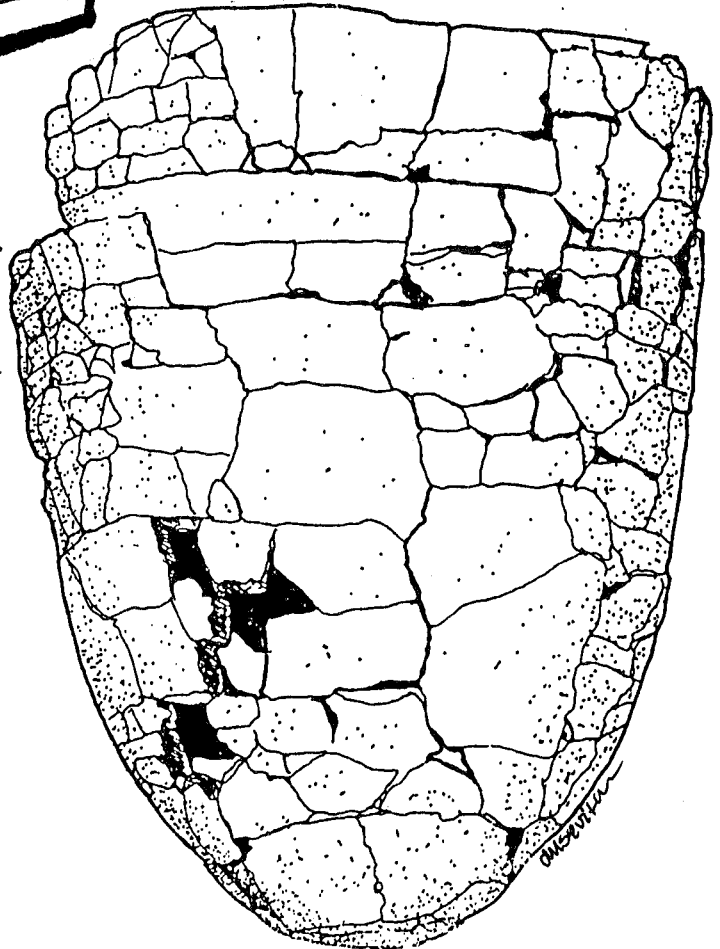
HANDTOOLS USED FOR EXCAVATION



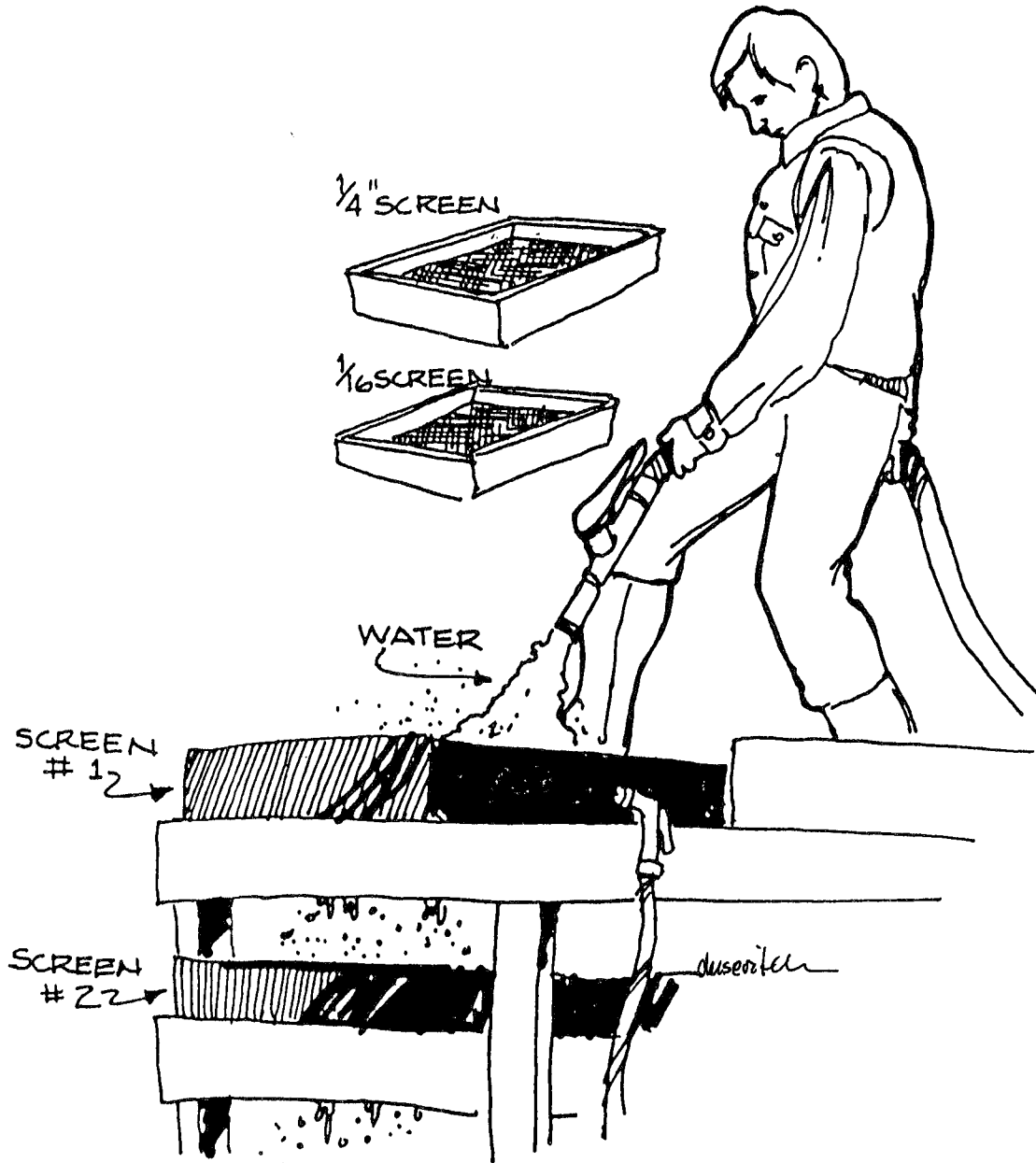
RECONSTRUCTING VESSELS
